

# Ryhal likely winner in S.C House 56, Duckworth defeats Edge in House 104, House 58 headed for runoff

Mike Ryhal is the likely winner in the hotly contested S.C. House 56 race.

With all 19 precincts reporting, the incumbent Republican tallied 1,278 votes versus 1,026 for his opponent Dennis DiSabato, according to unofficial results.

Once votes are certified Thursday, Ryhal will serve another two-year term in the state legislature.

District 56 includes mainly Carolina Forest and parts of Conway, Longs and Forestbrook.

In another hotly contested house race, challenger Greg Duckworth defeated incumbent Tracy Edge in S.C House 104 which includes North Myrtle Beach and Little River. Duckworth led Edge by a 2,366 to 1,582 vote margin with all precincts reporting.

In House 58, which includes western Conway, Aynor and Galivants Ferry, Jeff Johnson is emerging as the top vote getter with 1,605 votes. His closest competitor Jeffrey Garland had 865 votes with all 26 precincts reporting. Both will face off in a runoff in two weeks.

In Horry County's lone at large race, Kathy Ward defeated incumbent probate judge Deirdre Edmonds 9,705-8,755, according to unofficial results.
